"As best I can, the 'something' that I do will be to continue to serve those in poverty. It brings me great joy. Yes, I am Unbound."



Reflections on the Sunday Readings Second Sunday in Ordinary Time - 15 January 2023

Isaiah 49:3, 5-6. Psalm 40:2, 4, 7-8, 8-9, 10. 1 Corinthians 1:1-3. John 1:29-34.

What Baptism Makes of Us. We begin Ordinary Times this liturgical year full of baptismal reminders. Jesus ranks ahead of John the Baptist and all of us. But though greater, he, in his good Spirit, remains with all of us. In Baptism, we are God's servants, ordained to show God's glory (and not our own), and be about God's saving plan. And like Saint Paul and the Corinthians, we are called to be holy.

- How will I cherish Baptism today and rest in Christ loving me?
- How will I manifest God's glory in some simple word or work?
- How will I be holier today than I was yesterday?






Daybreak Signup
